- **Alyson Shupe, PhD was awarded the AWARD FOR TECHNICAL INNOVATION IN PUBLIC HEALTH**
(Established in 2006) (formerly P.W. Jacoe Award) Awarded to a person or group who has made an outstanding contribution in public health technology in Colorado.
- **Dr. Don Parson was awarded the JOHN MUTH AWARD (Established in 2000)**
Awarded to a member of CPHA who has made an outstanding contribution to the Association.
- **Kyle Leglieter, MPH was awarded the EMERGING LEADER IN PUBLIC HEALTH AWARD (Established in 2000)**
Awarded to an individual with less than five years service in public health, who has demonstrated outstanding initiative on behalf of the Colorado public health community.
- **Marilyn Bouldin, RN, MSN was awarded the LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD (Established in 1996)**
Awarded to an individual who has retired from full-time employment in public health, in recognition of their outstanding contributions and leadership in the field of public health.
- **Deborah Colburn was awarded the AWARD FOR LEGISLATIVE EXCELLENCE (Established in 1988)**
Awarded to a person or organization for highly visible past or present legislative efforts within the State or Nation in support of public health issues.
- **Community Advisory Council of the High Plains Research Network was awarded the FLORENCE SABIN AWARD (Established in 1947)**
Awarded for achievement in public health, honoring the outstanding leadership of Dr. Florence Sabin in the promotion of better public health in Colorado. The recipient must not be employed full-time in public health.

- **Michael Buchenau was awarded the FLORENCE SABIN AWARD (*Established in 1947*)**
Awarded for achievement in public health, honoring the outstanding leadership of Dr. Florence Sabin in the promotion of better public health in Colorado. The recipient must not be employed full-time in public health.

- **Julie White, RN, BSN was awarded the CHAMP AWARD (Community Health Action-Motivated Person) (*Established in 1982*)**
Awarded to a full-time public health employee who is not in a high-level management position. The recipient must be a member of CPHA and is selected on the basis of his or her helpful, courteous, and professional service in working with the public and fellow employees and whose outstanding service brings credibility and respect to the public health agency.

- **Bruce Nedrow (Ned) Calonge, MD, MPH was awarded the ROY CLEERE DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD (*Established in 1965*)**
Awarded to a person who has made an outstanding contribution to public health in Colorado and to the Association. The Colorado Public Health Association Distinguished Service Award was renamed in 1974 in honor of Dr. Cleere, who was the director of the Colorado Department of Health for 38 years. Dr. Cleere was the first recipient in 1965.
