



The Southern Colorado AIDS Project (S-CAP) is observing 25 years of service in 2011, to individuals, infected or at risk of HIV infection, in a 25 county area in southern Colorado. S-CAP maintains offices in Colorado Springs and Pueblo and annually provides client service programming to over 500 individuals and their families. Additionally, the organization provides prevention and educational programs.

During the past 12 months S-CAP, in collaboration with Pine Creek High School, Eyes Wide Open program created an educational display which was hosted at the Colorado Springs Fine Arts Center for two months. The display highlighted the historical social conflict within our nation around AIDS.

Additionally, educational displays were created for the two largest branches of the Pikes Peak Library District for the month of December in honor of World AIDS Day. In March, S-CAP hosted a luncheon for women in honor of National Women and Girls HIV/AIDS Awareness Day.

In 2010, S-CAP's speakers program reached over 5,000 young adults in the Pikes Peak region with medically accurate HIV information.
